S.C.O.P.E. originated in Canada's Centennial year of 1967, thus the name: Scouts Centennial Ontario Pennsylvania Expedition, when 541 Canadian Scouts visited the U.S.A. The Canadian Scouts returned the hospitality when 800 Boy Scouts of America visited Boyd Conservation Area in 1968. S.C.O.P.E. has continued in this fashion since 1968, with exchanges in 72/73, 76/77, 80/81, 84/85, 87/88, 91/92, 95/96, 99/00, 03/04, 07/08 and now 11/12.

S.C.O.P.E. is a unique scouting experience. In May 2011, the Americans will be visiting us and joining our families and Troops/Companies attending school / sightseeing and camping with their fellow Scouts/Venturers. In May 2012 our Scouts/Venturers will become part of a Pennsylvania family and Scout Troops..

You are invited to become one of the thousands of Scouts, Venturers and Leaders who have participated in S.C.O.P.E. since 1968 by attending S.C.O.P.E. 2011.

S.C.O.P.E. is much more than a great camp of 800+ Scouts. Each of our Scouts, Venturers and Leaders will billet an American youth or leader and the youth will attend school for one day with their Canadian hosts or go sightseeing. Each American Scout becomes a member of the Canadian Scout Troop/Section and family for the weekend. Lasting friendships have developed and all have a most rewarding experience.

The S.C.O.P.E. weekend is as follows:

Thursday: American youth and leaders travel from Pennsylvania by bus, will be met by their hosts family, and go to the host's home for supper.

Friday: Youth go to school, leaders set up camp. Youth arrive at camp in the evening

Saturday **Extraordinary activities**

Sunday: Break camp early and spend the day sightseeing with host. Stay overnight at host's house

Monday: Travel back to Pennsylvania in buses.
